David Caron is the C. William Maxeiner Distinguished Professor of Law at the University of California at Berkeley. He is the immediate past President of the American Society of International Law, and currently serves as Co-Director of the Law of the Sea Institute, Chair of the World Economic Forum Global Agenda Council on the Rule of Law, Member of the Board of Trustees of the California Ocean Science Trust and as a member of the Board of Editors of the *American Journal of International Law*. He presently serves also as a member of the U.S. Department of State Advisory Committee on Public International Law, is a member of the Bars of the State of California and of England and Wales, and is a Barrister with Chambers at 20 Essex Street.

David Caron is a graduate with high honors from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy where he also served as Commander of the Corps of Cadets. He thereafter served as Navigator and Ship Salvage Diving Officer aboard USCGC Polar Star in the Arctic.

Professor Caron has served as arbitrator, lead counsel and expert in both private and public international arbitral proceedings. Professor Caron has served as Chair of an ICSID Proceeding and as a member of several NAFTA Chapter 11 Arbitration Panels. From 1996 to 2003, he served as a Commissioner with the Precedent Panel (E2) of the U. N. Compensation Commission in Geneva resolving claims arising out of the 1990 Gulf War. In 2004-2005, Professor Caron served as lead counsel for the Government of Ethiopia before the Eritrea - Ethiopia Claims Commission.
