Commander Bowman joined the Academy's law faculty in July of 2009, after having served as legal advisor to Coast Guard operational commanders throughout New England on a wide variety of issues, including: maritime homeland security, maritime law enforcement, environmental protection and compliance, administrative law, and military justice. Additionally, Commander Bowman has prosecuted courts-martial as trial counsel, and has assisted the Department of Justice in prosecuting Coast Guard-initiated criminal cases, including as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney.

In the Summer of 2010, Commander Bowman was deployed as legal advisor to the National Incident Command for the response to the Deepwater Horizon Spill of National Significance in Washington, D.C. He returned to the Academy for the Fall 2010 semester and assumed new duties and responsibilities as Chief of the Law Faculty.

Prior to entering the Coast Guard's legal program, Commander Bowman served as the Assistant Senior Investigating Officer, Assistant Supervisor of Port Safety and Security, and Command Public Affairs Officer for Coast Guard Sector Baltimore, the parent command for Coast Guard operations on the Upper Chesapeake Bay and Potomac River. Commander Bowman also served for two years aboard the Coast Guard Cutter RED BIRCH (WLM 687) as its Operations Officer.
