Publication Consent Form

1. The U.S. Coast Guard Academy has accepted for publication an article entitled as follows:

2. The author warrants that he or she is the author of the Article and that the author is not party to any prior agreement by which the author has conveyed to any other person, publisher, or incorporated or unincorporated entity his or her right to grant the rights and permission as stated in this publication consent form.

3. In consideration of the publication or reproduction of the Article as part of the Journal of Cadet Research (JCR) by the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (CGA) and other good and valuable consideration, the author hereby grants a non-exclusive license to the CGA for the following purposes: to make minor revisions and changes to the article necessary to conform it to the style of the publication; to prepare an abstract of the article; to distribute copies of the Article by information services and the CGA website; to publish or republish copies of the Article as part of one or more compilations on any media including paper and electronic media; to allow academic institutions to provide copies of the Article to students; and to publish and distribute copies of the Article in accordance with the purposes of the CGA and the U.S. Government.

4. The author understands and hereby agrees that the JCR is a U.S. Government work and publication, and that in accordance with Title 17, U.S. Code, Section 105, the JCR does **not** have copyright protection. The author hereby agrees and grants to the JCR permission to establish and publish the Article as a “work of the United States Government,” as defined by Title 17 U.S. Code, Sections 101 & 105, which cannot be copyrighted. The author understands and agrees that neither the author nor the U.S. Government can obtain copyright protection of the Article after it is published by the JCR.

5. The author agrees that the Article may be reproduced in whole or in part by the JCR in current or future publications. The author understands that after publication he or she may share, re-publish, adapt, and use the Article, provided the author acknowledges in subsequent works the publication of the work in the JCR. In such case, the author agrees that if the published version of the Article is used in any other publication or posting, he or she must include a prominent statement of the full bibliographic details of the Article and a link to the Article in the online edition of JCR.

Publication Consent Form Instructions. The publication consent form must be completed by the author or authors before publication of the work by the U.S. Coast Guard Academy in the Journal of Cadet Research.

1. This provision establishes the title of the subject work as it will be published.
2. This provision establishes that the author holds all legal rights necessary to allow the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (CGA) to publish the work in the Journal of Cadet Research (JCR).
3. This provision serves as the legal grant of a license being given by the author to the CGA. It gives the CGA the right to make slight editorial revisions after the execution of this form. It also grants permission for the normal operations of commercial and other abstracting and indexing services that deal with the journal. Finally, it acknowledges that the journal will be published not only in print but also electronically, from where it can be printed, downloaded and saved. The grant is broad enough to cover compliance with Freedom of Information Act requests under 5 U.S.C. § 552 and distribution of the article to academic users.
4. In this provision, the author agrees to permit their work to be published as a work of the U.S. Government as defined by federal law in 17 U.S.C. §§ 101 & 105. By signing this agreement, the author agrees that their submitted work will not be afforded any copyright protection, and will be reproducible at will by the public. The CGA will request that any subsequent reproductions by any entity or individual include a courtesy line properly acknowledging and citing the work and the author, but cannot guarantee that such acknowledgements will be made.
5. This provision allows the JCR to use the submitted work in any of its publications, either current or in the future. It also requires the author to properly acknowledge and cite the final published JCR article, including full biographical details and a link to the article on the JCR website, if the author uses the article in any subsequent publication or posting.
